
Year 7 reading intervention also began this half term with the first group of 6 students having their initial session of an 8-week programme.

The Reading Ambassadors at JFC are going to be promoting the Reading Rampage in student assemblies along with other mini projects that have taken place this half term, including:


- Paired reading between Year 7 and Year 9/10/11 students

Also, as part of Children's Mental Health Week teams across our schools were encouraged to take part in daily reading sessions during the school day. Research from the National Literacy Trust shows that reading for just 10 minutes can help to reduce stress.








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Iveshead School launch their word of the week this term. Each week a new word will be shared which students should try and use in sentences throughout the week during their lessons.
